

REPORT ON 'ROAD SAFETY THROUGH SELF-TRANSFORMATION

The BKWSU has a General Consultative status with the Economic and Social Council (ECOSOC), a Consultative Status with the UNICEF of the United Nations and it is an affiliated member of the United Nations Department of Public Information. The BKWSU has always contributed to these bodies of the United Nations by bringing an ethical and spiritual touch to various projects such as, Million Minutes of Peace Appeal, Global Cooperation for a better world, Sharing our Values for a better world, and others.



And now, in the context of the UN Decade of Action for Road Safety (2011 - 2020), the BKWSU in Mauritius has implemented a project entitled *Road Safety through Self-Transformation*. Road Safety, in Mauritius, has become a major issue due to the growing number of vehicles on our road

networks. Road accidents are increasingly causing death, injuries and trauma to many. Authorities are doing their best to cope with this situation but accidents and fatalities remain on the rise. With a view to sensitising road users, the BKWSU has implemented the *Road Safety through Self-Transformation* project, thus putting the onus on knowing and understanding oneself in the exercise of accident prevention on the roads.

It started as a pilot project at the Eastern Stone Crusher at Laventure, where drivers showed a keen interest. The project was brought to the attention of the Mauritian Public at large during the UN Global Road Safety Week (6 - 12 May 2013), through awareness campaigns in different parts of the island. This was done in collaboration with the Special Road Safety Unit of the Prime Minister's Office and other stakeholders.

The project was presented in the capital city of Mauritius, Port Louis at the Municipal Council Hall through a press conference in the presence of the Lord Mayor, the Prime Minister's Adviser on Road Safety and other stakeholders. Our representative,

Mr P K Jagutpal, Project Coordinator explained all details through a PowerPoint presentation. The press conference aimed at sensitising the nation about the Road Safety Week and the initiative of the Brahma Kumaris World Spiritual University to make roads safer through spiritual skills and self-transformation.

Newspapers, television, banners, flyers, posters and charts were also used to inform the public about the whereabouts of the Project. The project took place from 6 - 12 May 2013 as follows:

• 6th May 2013 - Launching Ceremony

The programme comprised speeches by Mr R Bissoonauth, Municipal Counsellor of Curepipe, Mr Ben Buntipilly, Special Adviser on Road Safety

matters to the Prime Minister. This was followed by a PowerPoint presentation by Brother Pradeep Jagutpal, Project Coordinator of Brahma Kumaris on how to reduce accidents through self-control.
