When there is purity, of course there is lightness. When we are not using sense organs or any vices, like anger or attachment, then what it becomes like is an angelic form. Generally, the body is pulled strongly towards some traces of vice, or some kind of karmic accounts. Then we say things through our words, or do something that is not right. Baba said that the intellect should be very subtle, but also our energy should be very subtle. Not only the intellect, but the mind also, because of purity. Why are we observing purity? It is not only like, "Okay, I am free now." Baba talks of attachment, greed and anger in a subtle form, and we are removing all those traces also. Then the mind and intellect become very subtle like Baba described in the Murli. Words are still gross, but thoughts are very subtle. Especially when the thoughts are pure, and I am in communication with Baba. This spiritual chit-chat with Baba happens when there is a very subtle intellect and mind. One is that we tell Baba, we speak to Baba, but the other is the love and the faith that I am using to speak to Baba. It's not that I have any complaints or any needs, it's just my love for Baba. Love is something very subtle, but if I just talk as a practice or as a routine versus when you really do it from your heart, then there is a difference.

Purity should bring this quality of subtlety. Then it also becomes easy to connect with Avyakt Bapdada or even connect with Shiv Baba, incorporeal connecting with incorporeal Baba and in angelic subtle connecting with Avyakt Bapdada. Use the power of purity to become subtle. If there is purity, and still we use our organs or our language in an ordinary way, or even with body consciousness, then we are not becoming subtle. Baba said that when there is purity, there is subtle divinity in our features. Divinity will pull us, and we start becoming that image. Baba said that we change from Brahmin to angel, and from angel into a deity. Angels are very subtle. Even if your presence is there it's not the presence of a person but the presence of an angel.

If we really look into it, I am using the power of purity for subtle aspects - one is broad intellect, sharp intellect, smart intellect, but Baba was also saying subtle intellect, or subtle mind. Baba also talks of mansa seva. One is to generally just have good wishes and good feelings for everyone, another is using pure thoughts and remembrance of Baba. This is not only settling karmic accounts, but also finding solutions to different situations. There has to be this feeling that purity means I have to use my thoughts to serve, to resolve, and to find answers. Serve yourself and others through your subtle power of pure thoughts and pure feelings. I think we do this, but not that much, right? Brahma Baba always used his subtle power and he did mansa seva, whether it was for creating tasks, or for whatever obstacles came. Later we started saying that Baba used to give sakaash when there were obstacles or even medical needs. Baba would give sakaash, along with sweet water (sugar and water), he would give drishti, send it for the patient, and the patient would be cured. For ourselves also, whatever health reasons are there, when you are eating and drinking, just be in a very pure feeling and that is going to help you.

Subtle powers are very important. You would call that a personality of purity. Everyone will know that their drishti and their words will bring blessings in practical life. Yes, we

have been bestowed upon, but we also have to become bestowers of blessings to everyone. Subtly look into yourself, how quickly do you know when you are being pulled out? Baba also said that things start pulling us out, but when there is something out we should be pulled inside more, so that we can use that subtle power. As soon as there is something outside, just go in and then you see how you find the answers. Generally, we stay out a lot, so there is no power in the mind, no power in the thoughts. Only the intellect keeps working, and the thoughts keep coming. So look into the power of subtlety.
