

YOUNG JEWELS CORNER

Rangolis/Kolam originated in India and it is especially drawn with rice flour infront of the main entrance of the house. The purpose of this tradition is to serve the small creatures as a source of food and to bring peace, positivity and happiness to the household. It started with a few dots and lines and later on colours were added to bring unigueness to the design. During Deepavali celebration Hindu houses are decorated with this rangoli to welcome Goddess Laksmi whom symbolises wealth and prosperity.

I (Anisha Kashyap*) was inspired to do a diya (earthen lamp) as it brings light to the world and dispels darkness. I used simple items such as bowls, squeeze bottle, rings, bracelets and bobby pins to create them.
