Arriving in Sydney, Didi was welcomed at Five Dock centre with a dance and BKs with Shiv Baba flags.

Didi read Murli from Thursday to Monday and gave a short class on the weekend days. Thursday 25 August was Dadiji's day and Didi shared a few stories about the sweetness and other qualities of Dadiji.





During Didi's visit in Sydney there were four rakhi ceremonies with a full hall each time. Over 400 souls had rakhi tied in Sydney. Didi gave drishti and applied a tilak while other sisters tied rakhi and gave toli and special hand-made blessings.



The first session on Thursday night was for contact souls and BKs. On Saturday there were rakhi ceremonies in the morning and evening. The morning rakhi was built into a half day retreat coinciding with the Global Bhatti

including Sr Jayanti's class online and time for yoga and lunch. The Saturday evening group enjoyed dinner after having their rakhi tied. The final final rakhi session was on Sunday morning after breakfast. Before each session Didi reminded everyone about the significance of rakhi being to tie the thread of making a promise to finish the weaknesses within.

As Didi was not travelling to other centres, it was quite a confluence at Five Dock centre with waves of BKs coming in turn. Apart from around Sydney, a group came by car from Canberra (approx. 3hrs), others from the two retreat centres near Sydney, Wollongong, Newcastle and a few from regional areas.
