# 7th Report on the UN Climate Change Conference COP28 8-9 Dec. 2023 – Dubai, UAE

The climate talks in Dubai are entering their second week and final phase. However, governments are still seriously divided on the central question of whether to phase out fossil fuels or not. Dan Jorgensen, Denmark's climate minister, who has been asked to forge an agreement, said: "We cannot negotiate The with nature. climate cannot compromised. No well-meaning words will change a single thing unless we act." This week may be our last opportunity to bring us on course to keeping the 1.5C limit alive. So, the talks are entering a crucial phase, and literally, the future of humanity is at stake.

In today's Climate Wisdom series, the moderator Sonja reminded us of our interconnection with nature and the possibility of feeling grief when the environment is deteriorating, she said: "I remember experiencing climate grief when I noticed birch trees drying up in my home town." The panel of experts were **Maureen, Bishop Marika Markovits** - Linköping Diocese, Sweden and **Lora Almutairi** - Public Authority of Agriculture Affairs, Kuwait

**Bishop Marika** shared that "As a diver, I feel sad to see that the seas have become empty and the coral reefs degraded; I feel my own responsibility because of my extensive travel across the world and I am doing my bit to compensate". **Sr. Maureen** explained that "When we feel that we can do something to make a difference, it helps to alleviate the grief. "We usually take from nature, but seldom give; having good wishes, pure feelings and vibrations for nature can immensely benefit it." **Lora** shared the predicament faced by the developing countries who are offered the technology but not the fund. "If we want to address this problem, we must start with the community, especially educating children about climate change." Compassion and sustainable action underlined the essence of the discussion. Bishop Marika brought a serene closure to the program with a prayer specially created and dedicated to COP28.

The UN Convention to Combat Desertification (UNCCD) organized a side event at the Faith Pavilion, titled: Mobilising Faith Community Towards Land Restoration. The panelists from various faith communities and religions explored the common values that underpin our responsibility to care for the Earth. Sister Maureen represented the Brahma Kumaris and she shared the stage with. One of the key messages shared by all was that God loves all the creation - including nature, so it is our duty to protect it. Sister Maureen shared, that when we work with the land, we shall do it not only with our hands but also with our heart, otherwise, too often is just short term. Panelists spoke about the need for a call of hope - justice, and responsibility towards the most vulnerable: children, women, and indigenous peoples. The establishment of the Loss and Damage fund in COP27 was appreciated and its operationalization in COP28 was acknowledged, all with a clear understanding that the fund being based on grants, not loans. All agreed about the need to include non-economical loss and damage aspects; that what has value, now always has price. How to monetarize loss of hope? The session ended with the summary, where sister Maureen shared her good wish to let God's love and wisdom guide our every thought, word, and action, and let our faith and determination be absolutely infectious.
